Parents in the school

Now that the 1.5 meters distance has been released by the government, we have discussed in the team how we want to deal with it as a school. We have noticed that going to school independently has resulted in greater independence in the younger children in particular. They can put on and take off their coat themselves, store their bags, and arrange food and drink items. We would like to retain that independence, but we also think it is important to introduce parents of the youngest groups to the ins and outs of a primary school.

That is why we have made the following agreement: the parents of groups 1 to 3 can walk into school with their child's group once a week. You can then see how independently your child can clean up all his/her things. You then deliver your son/daughter to the classroom and he/she enters the classroom alone. At 8.45 am the bell rings and all parents leave the school. If many parents want to come in on the same day from groups 1 to 3, we ask you to come on another day.

For the children of groups 4 to 8 it is not necessary to walk into the school. The children are self-reliant enough to do it themselves.

For the time being, all groups will still be picked up from the square by the teacher at 8.35 am.

WNT week



From October 11 to October 14, 2021 is the first WNT week (Nature Science Technology) of this school year. The theme of this WNT week is 'The Weather'.

These days the children will make all kinds of discoveries in their own group by means of experiments and experiments. For example, they will make lightning themselves or learn how to make a cloud.

We have beautiful teaching boxes on loan from Natuur en Milieu Education with all kinds of equipment to measure the weather. Rain or shine.

Mediator training

Since the introduction of De Vreedzame/Peaceful School, we have been working with mediators. Conflict resolution is central to this. Pupils are trained as pupil mediators, to help schoolmates who cannot resolve a disagreement themselves. They help the children who want to and are calm again. It doesn't concern fights. All students learn at De Vreedzame School what the difference is between a disagreement and a fight. By working with the Peaceful School, we will also use mediators during the children's breaks. Students from groups 7 and 8 can apply for the role of mediator. Ultimately, a choice is made of students who can meet the following profile:



- Being a good listener
- wanting the best for both students who have the disagreement (win-win situation)
- executing the steps according to the step-by-step plan

A mediator never works alone. There are always 2 mediators on the square. A mediator is never used if there is:

- a fight,
- if it concerns more than 2 students,
- bullying.

In all these cases the teacher is immediately called in.

If your son/daughter wants to participate as a mediator, he/she will receive training to do so. This is provided by teacher Nancy (group 8). Parental consent will of course be requested.

Day of preschool/voorschool

In collaboration with Kleintje Zuid we participate in the Day of the Preschool.

This day is intended for orienting parents with children between the ages of 2 and 3 years.

Parents can walk into the school without obligation and receive information and a tour through the school.

Last day at Schreuder

Dear Schreuder Parents and Guardians,

My very last Newsletter for you. Today, Thursday, I visited all the groups to say goodbye to them, to give a small present to each child and a group gift. Great to see all those faces again. I know (almost) all of them and they know me. They are in my heart, as are the team members and many of you.

I look back on seven intensive, but wonderful years. How much has been achieved! The Vreedzame (Peaceful) School has been introduced (2015) and is, as it were, at the seams of the building: we are the Peaceful School! Together with the former KDV Schreuder, an after-school program has been set up for our students since 2015, which now includes school chess and Mad Science. In addition, English is a language that is taught from group 1 (2016) and Spanish has been part of the school curriculum for a number of years

from group 5 (2017). The Socrates group (2017) for gifted students has also become an integral part of Schreuder. We have also become a Healthy School in 2017 in which healthy eating and drinking habits and sufficient exercise are recorded at school.

In 2018, 'the sole proprietorship' of Institute Schreuder ended and the school is affiliated with AMOS. Unfortunately, the year 2020 was dominated by corona and the lockdown, but also dominated in a positive way by the arrival of Vlinderboom and uniQ. This has resulted in even more diversity in the educational offer for our students: WNT week, tutor reading, close reading and world orientation with Blink.

Schreuder now moves on to the next step. Development in education never stops. I wish the school, the team and you every success in this.

On behalf of the parents and staff, the participation council advises and approves important decisions by management and the board. Now that Femmie is leaving, the board of AMOS has asked the MR to agree to the arrival of an interim director. The MR recently had a meeting with the intended candidate, Mr Henk Helder. Based on this conversation, the MR considers Henk a suitable candidate to lead Schreuder in the coming period. According to the MR, there are sufficient tasks for further connection after the previous merge of the Vlinderboom and Schreuder school.

In the longer term, the school wants to work more closely with the Dr. Rijk Kramer School. Both schools have several similarities, according to AMOS, and working together can make better use of support services and exchange successful methods and programs. The MR takes a critical look at this proposal and will base its advice on the interests of the school and its students. We have contacted the MR of the Dr. Rijk Kramerschool to advise as well as possible on behalf of everyone.


Old school photo
