From our school board

Dear parents/carers,

We already told you in our first 'news flashes': we (Martine, Kees and Jan) started on January 10 as the new management of primary school Schreuder. It was a great start and we felt very welcome. Both by the team at school and by you as parents in the first Works Council meeting and during the 'Meet & Greet'.

At the same time, it is of course a very crazy start in the middle of a lockdown situation with many Corona cases. In the meantime, 5 of the 7 regular groups and 2 of the 3 Amos unIQ groups have been or are still in quarantine. This causes a lot of unrest at school and among the children.

Experience shows that teachers also regularly drop out as a result of Corona. We always do our very best to arrange a good replacement. This is often successful, but unfortunately not in all cases due to the teacher shortage and Corona.

We hope to put this situation behind us soon so that we can all teach at school again. Fortunately, the rules for quarantine were relaxed last week. If you are not sure whether your child is allowed to come to school, you can do the quarantine check of the central government:

We noticed that Schreuder primary school is a great school with a great team. It is a pity that not many more children and parents benefit from this. That is why one of our priorities is to put the school on the map even better. A cautious start was made with this last year and we will continue with full energy. Together with the team. But also happy to work with you. This theme will be discussed regularly in our consultations with the Works Council and the MR. And soon there will be another information meeting for orienting parents, see later in the newsletter.

Change in internal supervisors (IB-ers)

As of January 10, there will be a change in the distribution of the groups between our 2 internal supervisors: Rebecca Verdellen and Ria van Gerven. Rebecca Verdellen is now supervisor of the regular groups 1 to 4 and will work 1x a week on Thursdays from February 3rd. Ria van Gerven is there on Mondays and Fridays for the regular groups 5 to 8 and the Amos unIQ groups.

Hereby she introduces herself:

Dear parents, carers,



Introducing myself, I am Ria van Gerven, since 2010 internal supervisor (ib'er) at Amos education. I have worked in several schools before. Until January 10, I worked as an internal supervisor for the Nautilus and Amos UnIQ (Schreuder). On January 10, the Schreuder groups 5 – 8 were added.

Now you know which schools and groups I am linked to, but that doesn't say much. So here's a little bit: who am I and what do I do?

My name is Ria van Gerven (58). Besides ib'er I am also wife, mother, mother-in-law and grandmother. When my children were still in school I did a lot of volunteer work at school and one day I thought: "I really just want to go and work at a school!". Quite exciting, because that meant going back to studying (Ipabo) when you were in your late thirties and so eventually standing in front of the class. I liked working at school and studying so much that I wanted to continue learning right away. That is why I started the Master SEN (Special Education Needs) fairly soon after completing the Ipabo, the training you need to become an ib'er. I have been an ib'er for over 10 years now. I now have a lot of practical experience and thanks to a number of studies (Remedial Teaching, Writing with Pen and Test, Language Coordinator and Image Coaching) I have also gained a lot of theoretical knowledge.

What does an ib'er do?

Thinking along with teachers about things they encounter, for example:

A student who does not progress 'further', a subject that is not going well, test results, class management (independent work, instruction, who is sitting where,....)

Consultations/conversations with:

Teachers, Management, Parents, Pupils, External parties (compulsory education desk, school doctor, parent-child advisor, speech therapist, youth care, etc.), Other ib'ers

Peaceful School

On Monday 24 January we started a new block of the Peaceful School: Block 4 "We have a heart for each other"
Goal: the children learn to recognize feelings and deal with them.

This block is about feelings. Being able to deal with feelings is of great importance for a positive climate in the classroom and in the school. A climate in which we have a "heart for each other", in which we treat each other with respect. This is easier if children are able to name their feelings and put themselves in the shoes of others. The realization that everyone has feelings and that the same event can evoke different feelings in people. This helps them to resolve conflicts positively.

In order to be able to talk about feelings with each other, it is important that the children feel safe in the group; at the same time, these conversations promote safety in the group. A familiar atmosphere is created.

We will talk about feelings like anger and sadness. What it means when someone is left out, what it does to them and that it is a form of bullying.

The children learn to recognize what makes them angry and how they express their anger. They learn that "cooling down" is important to be able to resolve a conflict.

Block 4 is also about being happy, being satisfied, about standing up for each other. The lessons are about things that you like and that make you happy. As a result, it is becoming more and more "normal" to talk about feelings at school; in the beginning it is often still uncomfortable.

Of course we take into account that not every child talks about his or her feelings with ease. The children are given the space to choose what they want to say about their feelings
