The MR is an important and legally required body within the school. The MR gives advice or consents to important decisions that the school board or AMOS board must make with regard to the school. In recent years, the MR has dealt with a number of difficult files and the MR foresees the necessary challenges for our historic primary school in the heart of Amsterdam in the future.

We cordially invite parents of students at Schreuder who feel involved in our special school and want to be a sounding board for the daily management of the school to apply. In the case of multiple candidates, the MR is obliged to hold elections. We would like to see a new representative in the MR involved for several years, so preference is given to parents of students in the lower years.

With the arrival of the Vlinderboom and the associated challenges, the MR expanded the occupation at the time to 3 parents and 3 teachers. For a small school like Schreuder, however, this is a generous representation, especially for the workload on the staff. The MR has therefore decided to return to an occupation of 2 parents and 2 staff members per school year 2022-2023.

Vreedzame School (Peaceful school)



We dragen allemaal een steentje bij

On March 28 we will start with block 5 of the Peaceful School: "We all contribute". Goal: The children feel involved in the group, the school and the education. They think about and contribute to the lesson objectives. As a result, they become more owner of their own learning process and the school culture. The children learn to see what their own role is in a (conflict) situation and can deal with this proactively.

In groups 1 to 4, the lessons are aimed at:

- recognize anger in yourself and others
- learn to deal with your anger
- make amends after a conflict
- learn to look for solutions to a conflict
- learn the difference between helping and interfering
- learn the difference between helping in a conflict as an arbitrator and helping as a mediator
- learn that at school you can ask student mediators to help when you have a conflict

In groups 4 to 8 & all uniQ groups the children learn

- how we can make our own contribution to the group and to the school
- how they can come up with activities to make it even more fun for everyone in the classroom and in the school
- how to make a newspaper for the parents about what they have done for the class and for the school
- what the difference is between carrying out assignments and coming up with and co-deciding on plans and activities that are good for the group
- work with class committees and school committees.

But what is important is to offer a hopeful perspective.

Together we have thought with the children to be able to mean something and we will do this through a fundraising campaign! We collect as many cuddly toys as possible with a sweet message from our KleintjeZuid children and bring them to the Ukrainian children who have arrived in the Netherlands. In this way we want to give them a safe feeling and a little extra love!

In any case, we can't wait for spring to come, can you?

Together with the children, we will bring spring into Kleintje Zuid with delicious flower bulbs in pots. From grape hyacinths, crocuses, tulips, daffodils to fragrant hyacinths. We have spring in our head at the Museum Quarter ;)



From the Schoolboard

Temporary site manager

Since January of this year, Martine and Jan have been the directors of both Rijk Kramer and Schreuder primary school. Together with Kees as deputy director. So we have to divide ourselves over three locations. We have recently noticed that this is not working well enough at the moment and that the accessibility of the school and the availability of leadership are not yet sufficient. We have therefore chosen, in consultation with and with the support of the board, to temporarily appoint a location leader for three days a week.

Martine and Jan will remain management and will be regularly present at school. However, the day-to-day management is temporarily taken over by the location leader, who will also act as the first point of contact. With this we hope to improve the accessibility of the school and the management and to have more time to properly tackle important topics (such as promoting the school). We expect to have more news about this shortly. We will then inform you in a separate message.

Study day March 18 and April 6

On March 18 we had another study day as a team. In the morning we discussed how we can profile the school even better. In the afternoon the teachers attended a workshop on the so-called 'executive skills' of children. These are skills such as planning and organizing, thinking before you act, concentrating, etc. It was a good and instructive afternoon. Another study day will follow on April 6. Then we as a school discuss the results so far and see where we can do things even better or differently.

Restart Socrates

Last week the Socrates groups started up again. Miss Roos provides the lessons for groups 2 to 8 and temporarily replaces Miss Cristina.

The lessons consist of project work, creative thinking, lessons about the brain and doing research. It is not additional math or language education. This is offered in the classes according to level. The students are referred to the Socrates group via the teacher and/or IB. The composition may vary from period to period. The teacher will inform you when your child participates.

Since this school year I have been supervising students of the uniQ groups outside the classroom and now replace Miss Cristina in taking care of the Socrates groups.
