WNT Week (Science, Nature, Technology)

On Thursday afternoon June 16, we will make a fantastic WNT afternoon. The theme this time is water. We set up 20 different experiments in the school to do together with the teachers. They are about water pressure, different weights in water, buoyancy possibilities and also rain. In addition, the children learn about the measures that are/were taken in the Netherlands to make it possible to live in areas threatened by water. We make a translation to, for example, the NAP and why canals have been built in Amsterdam.

Peaceful School block 6



On May 30, a new block of the Peaceful School will be started, namely

Block 6 “We are all different”

Goal: an open attitude among the students with regard to differences between people.
